A normal change is one that is not standard and not emergency and typically requires an important change to a service or the IT infrastructure. A normal change is subject to the full change management review process, including review by the Change Advisory Board (CAB) and authorization/rejection. Additional Change Requests may include:

The change management team must be aware of the planning of such changes and so it is our recommendation that no CAB (Change Advisory Board) approval is granted for changes without a specific plan, including dates, times and teams. Essentially the change must be fully planned prior to approval and release of the change.
